Shemin Nurseries provides TREE-MENDOUS MARYLAND with high quality native trees and shrubs at reasonable prices for public land planting. **Your pre-paid order may be picked up at Shemin Nurseries.** For an additional charge, Shemin Nurseries will deliver your order directly to your planting site. (Minimum delivery 25 trees.) Please arrange your delivery directly with Shemin Nurseries 301-421-1220 after receiving an order confirmation from us.

A single delivery at no additional charge will be made early in the season to DNR sites to assist your pick-up in outlying regions; Western (Greenbrier SP), Eastern Shore (Tuckahoe SP) & Southern (Cedarville State Forest) counties. If you wish to be included in one of these outlying deliveries, please place your order before OCTOBER 1ST. For specific information, call 410-260-8510.

After processing your order, a **Confirmation E-Mail with your Order #** and species ordered will be sent to you. All plants must be picked up by November 19th. **NOTE:** Be sure to count your trees & shrubs at Shemin BEFORE you leave the grounds. Shortages discovered later will NOT be replaced.)

Please bring your confirmation notice with you to pick up your order.

This is NOT a program for planting on PRIVATE PROPERTY. All trees must be planted on public land including parks, community open spaces, rights-of-ways, government facilities, and school grounds.

TREE-MENDOUS MARYLAND, a program of the Maryland Forest Service, remains one of our most popular programs aimed at helping citizens restore tree cover on public land and community open space in Maryland. To date, we have assisted more than 3,000 towns and communities, parks, and schools planting trees and shrubs to help clean the water, clean the air, and keep our towns and cities inviting, livable, and environmentally viable places to live.

Consider the following species for your fall planting:

★ **Red flowering dogwood** (*Cornus florida*) is the '*Chief*' of the dogwood family. Its showy display of blooms in Spring is a stunning deep rich red. Fall foliage is a bright crimson color that seems to last forever. '*Cherokee Chief*' dogwood grows to a height of 20'-25' and spreads 12'-15'. New foliage is reddish-bronze. Cannot tolerate wet feet. Excellent for wildlife.

★ **Fringe tree** (*Chionanthus virginicus*) is great for woodland or understory, easy to grow, beautiful spreading small (12' to 20') native multi or single stemmed tree. Prefers sun and medium moisture, but tolerates shade and adapts to a variety of soil conditions. Covered with slightly fragrant, eye-catching fringy white blooms after dogwoods fade in May. Medium-dark green lustrous leaves turn bright yellow in fall. Excellent for wildlife.

★ **Virginia sweetspire** (*Itea virginica*) is an open, upright deciduous shrub growing 3'-4' tall. Slightly fragrant clusters of cascading 3"-6" white flowers in early summer. Leaves are glossy green turning red-purple in autumn. Semi-evergreen leaves may remain on the plant through December. Amazingly adaptable to a wide range of conditions, including full sun to part shade, and moist to dry soils. Provides protective cover for birds and attracts butterflies and other pollinators. Easily transplanted and very easy to grow with no serious insect or disease problems.
